The Fritzen Family During World War II

World War II brought immense hardships to people around the world, including food and fuel shortages, rationing, and economic instability. Many civilians were forced to flee their homes and become refugees, while others were subjected to brutal oppression, forced labor, and genocide. The war brought profound grief and loss, as families and communities mourned the deaths of loved ones and struggled to rebuild in the aftermath of destruction. Among some of the families that experienced some of

this was the Fritzen family. Achim Fritzen, the husband of Mary Jane Groberg, had several memories about his family's time during the war. He pointedly remembered his parents' compassion towards others at the time. At the time, there were prisoners of the war that were sent to work in German industry. The working and living conditions were decent for some and abominable for others. At one time, Johann (Achim's father) allowed a few English, French, and Italian men to work in his garden. He would then feed them and speak to them in English and/or French. This would have been a great act of kindness towards these men and, according to Achim, "This type of kindness was very dangerous, especially to speak in their languages." Amelia Earhart once said, "A single act of kindness throws out roots in all directions, and the roots spring up and make new trees." This was most certainly true in this case, and very needed too. The fact that they had this compassion for others despite the hardships in their own life is truly remarkable. The severity of the situation is exemplified by the fact that school was canceled for nine months and Achim's dad narrowly escaped death at one point. As time went on, the inevitable finally happened, Johann was transferred to a different town to help more with the war efforts. It was a trying time for the Fritzen family, and Achim, being the oldest, felt a weight descend onto his shoulders.

Despite the war being over, the trials the family had to face were not. On May 3, 1945, soldiers approached the cabin that the Fritzens were in. They then proceeded to ask Johann if he had been a Nazi. Johann answered in the affirmative. Martin Luther King Jr. in a particular instance declared, "The ultimate measure of a man is not where he stands in moments of comfort and convenience, but where he stands at times of


challenge and controversy." Johann's answer to this question speaks to the kind of man he was. He did not wish to be a Nazi as time went on, but once you joined, getting out was not so easy. Johann could have easily lied due to this fact, but being the man he was, he had a standard of integrity and honesty to uphold...and he did. He would end up dying in a Russian Prison camp before seeing his family again. The family would then see another death a short time later — the death of the youngest son, Detlef. Achim's mother, Anny, at this point must have been crushed. She had now lost her husband

and child yet couldn't afford to give up. She truly was an amazing lady. Anny continued to add to her resume as the family escaped westward. On the journey many more challenges were overcome, some being starvation, evading capture, etc. They eventually reached their final destination; a place called Rheidt. With time, living conditions improved and Anny attempted to make life for her children as normal as possible. Moving west proved to be a very important decision because had they stayed, they would have been stuck in East Germany with the Berlin Wall. East Germany had less than ideal living conditions and at the time was a Soviet-controlled communist regime that deprived people of basic freedom. Instead, the family lived in a nation marked by general prosperity, democracy, and opportunity. Their standards of living would only improve from here.

In conclusion, "Success is not final, failure is not fatal: it is the courage to continue that counts." (Winston Churchill). This quote highlights the importance of perseverance in the face of challenges and setbacks. It reminds us that success and failure are not permanent states, but rather, they are part of the ongoing journey towards achieving our goals. The courage to keep going, even in the face of adversity, is what ultimately leads to success. The Fritzen family exhibited this perfectly. They had their hardships without a doubt, but kept going and kept moving forward. Their story is motivation and teaches key values of perseverance, honesty, integrity, among other things. Understanding our family stories is highly important and, in the words of Maya Angelou, "In


